whatsoever to my deare and loving father and mother Thomas Grey of Eddington in
the County of Wilts Gent and Mary his wife to be amongst my brother and sister
And as they shall thinke fitt and convenient And of this my Will I make Thomas
Grey and John Grey my brother full and whole Executors And I doe hereby
revoke all former Wills and Testaments by mee at any time made In witness whereof
I have hereunto sett my hand and scale this thirtenth day of November Anno Dni 1677

I commend my Soule into the hands of God that gave it ad into the hands of a father
Creator trusting to be saved by his rich mercy in Jesus Christ And my body to be
buried according to the discretion of my Executors Item I give unto my three
sonnes William Gilbert and Francis Clisson twenty shillings a peece and ad much to my
daughter Elizabeth wifes of Fumhead to buy each of them a Ring Item I give unto the
wive of the Parish of Marnhull twenty poundes of good and lawfull money of England
to be distributed among them according to the discretion of my Executors Item I
give to whosoever shall happen to be my servant at the day of my death forty
shillings Item I give unto my son Francis Clisson the summe of a hundred pound
to be dispensed to him according as my Executors shall thinke best for his advantage
All the rest of my Goods undispensed of I give to my three daughters Jane Mary
and Hester Clisson to be divided betwene them equally save only that I would have
Jane to have Ten poundes more then any of the rest And I make my said three
daughters Jane Mary and Hester Clisson my sole and whole Executors of this my
last Will and Testament In witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand and
scale May the eighteenth In the year of our Lord according to the Computacion

In the Name of God Amen The first day of November in the fifth and twentyeth year of the Reigne of our Sovereigne Lord Charles the second by the grace of God of England Scotland France and Ireland King Defender of the faith etc. Jonathan Godfrey the elder of Kintbury in the County of Berke person being at this present sick and infirme of Body but of good and perfect memory shal be to God Almighty for the same doe revoke disannul countermand and hereby declare to be void all former Wills and Testaments by mee heretofore made and doe make this my last Will and Testament in manner and forme following first and principally before all other things I doe most humbly comend my Soule into the hands of Almighty God my Creator with full hope and assured trust and confidence through the merits of our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ to have the free pardon and forgiveness of all my sinns and offences and as for my Body my Will is that the same shall be buried in decent manner according to the discretion of my Executors hereinafter named with the like hope trust and confidence that according to the Article of my faith it shall at the last day arise againe and be reunited unto my Soule and from thenceforth remaine in all Joy and blessedness forevermore and as for that measure of worldly Estate wherewith it hath pleased Almighty God to bless mee withall my Will is as followeth first I doe devise give and bequeath unto Sarah my well beloved wife all the power right title and interest that I now have or hereafter may or might have of in or unto my late messuage or Tenement and House with the appurtenances called William by force and virtue of a mortgage to mee therof made by my son Jonathan Godfrey Item I doe give devise and bequeath unto my said son Jonathan Godfrey one shilling Item I doe give devise and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Ten poundes of lawfull money of England and to her son Francis my Godson five poundes of like lawfull money Item I doe give devise and bequeath unto my daughter Jane one hundred poundes of like lawfull money of England to be paid within three yeares next after my decease Item I doe give devise and bequeath unto my daughter Martha two hundred and ten poundes of like lawfull money of England to be paid within two yeares next after my decease Item I doe give devise and bequeath unto my son Bartholomew (who hath been absent from my dwelling house for the space of three yeares or thereabouts) and to his heirs and assigns forever all my messuages Lands Tenements and hereditaments whatsoever with the appurtenances situate lying and being within the Parish of Kintbury aforesaid wherof or wherem I have any Estate of freehold or Inheritance in possession Reversion or Remainder in what so ever my said son Bartholomew doth returne and come home personally to my said now dwelling house in Kintbury aforesaid within the space of seven yeares next following after my decease and not otherwise And I doe give devise and bequeath unto my said Executors the use and the profits issues and profits thereof for so long time
